Ghosts for Six Violas Program Note

Ghosts for six violas was written for the studio of my colleague Helen Callus. It is an independent work, but can also be played simultaneously with my Lament for viola solo, creating what in effect is a concerto for solo viola accompanied by a consort of six violas called Lament Amid Silence.

Ghosts portrays an agitated and desperate set off my two lengthy quiet sections, the second a consolatory chorale. Anguished desperation is expressed through such instrumental techniques as playing very near the bridge, over-bowing, and quarter tones, evoking rage and despair contrasting with the chorale, which features soft, quiet, tonal chords.

Ghosts, like Lament, is characterized by low silences setting off isolated gestures, but here, the silences are even longer, and the short gestures less frequent: we hear the ghosts that are the background for the world of Lament. At the end, the descending figures are heard against an extended, low pedal point, eventually dying out one by one, ending with a single pizzicato note, then silence.
